

DECISION OF THE COLLEGE OF THE
EUROPEAN PUBLIC PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE
OF 12 FEBRUARY 2025

DESIGNATING A EUROPEAN DELEGATED
PROSECUTOR PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 16(7) OF THE
EPPO REGULATION AND ASSIGNING ADDITIONAL
TASKS

The College of the European Public Prosecutor's Office (EPPO),

Having regard to the Council Regulation (EU) 2017/1939 of 12 October 2017 implementing enhanced cooperation on the establishment of the European Public Prosecutor's Office ('the EPPO') (hereinafter referred to as "the EPPO Regulation"), and in particular Articles 13(2), 16(7), 17 and 96 thereof,

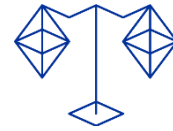
Having regard to the Regulation No 31 (EEC), 11 (EAEC), laying down the Staff Regulations of Officials and the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants of the European Economic Community and the European Community of Atomic Energy, hereinafter respectively referred to as "the Staff Regulations" and "the CEOS" and in particular to Article 123 of the CEOS,

Having regard to the Decision 001/2020 of the College of the European Public Prosecutor's Office of 29 September 2020 laying down rules on the conditions of employment of the European Delegated Prosecutors, as subsequently amended and supplemented (hereinafter referred to as "the CEEDP"), and in particular Articles 14 to 16 thereof,

Having regard to the Decision 003/2020 of the College of the European Public Prosecutor's Office of 12 October 2020 on the Internal Rules of Procedure of the EPPO (hereinafter referred to as "the Internal Rules of Procedure"), as subsequently amended and supplemented, and in particular Articles 31 and 34 thereof,

Having regard to the Decision 002/2021 of the College of the European Public Prosecutor's Office of 13 January 2021 on the Financial Rules applicable to the EPPO, as subsequently amended, (hereinafter "the Financial Rules"), and in particular Article 78 thereof,

Having regard to the Decision 013/2021 of the College of the European Public Prosecutor's Office of 24 February 2021 laying down rules on the tasks and rights of the European Delegated Prosecutors designated to substitute the European Prosecutor of their Member State (hereinafter "the College Decision 013/2021"),



Having regard to the reasoned proposal of Mr Martin Bresman, European Prosecutor from the Kingdom of Sweden, dated 30 January 2025, as further specified on 4 February 2025, proposing to the College to approve:

- the designation of Mr Jerker Asplund, European Delegated Prosecutor in Sweden, to substitute him in case he is unable to carry out his functions or leaves his position pursuant to Article 16(7) of the EPPO Regulation, for a period of two (2) years, starting from the entry into force of the Decision of the College confirming this designation, and
- the assignment to Mr Jerker Asplund of additional tasks, pursuant to Articles 2 and 3(2) of the College Decision 013/2021, namely:
 - the responsibility to coordinate with the Swedish Economic Crime Authority (SECA) regarding the EPPO decentralised office in Stockholm, situated within SECA's premises, including for example the staff ("NEDPAs") disposal employed by SECA put at the EPPO's, work environment and security, IT and other equipment;
 - the responsibility to coordinate with national authorities regarding for example criminal reports and investigative resources;
 - the responsibility to coordinate contacts with news media at the decentralised level;
 - other coordination tasks assigned to him by the European Prosecutor from Sweden.

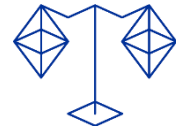
Acknowledging that the European Prosecutor from Sweden proposes that the role provided for in Article 16(7) of the EPPO Regulation will be assumed by each European Delegated Prosecutor in Sweden based on the principle of rotation every second year;

Has adopted this Decision:

Article 1

Designation pursuant to Article 16(7) EPPO Regulation

The College approves the designation of Mr Jerker Asplund, European Delegated Prosecutor in the Kingdom of Sweden, to substitute the Swedish European Prosecutor in case he is unable to carry out his functions or leaves his position pursuant to Article 16(7) of the EPPO Regulation, for a period of two (2) years starting from the date of the entry into force of this Decision.



Article 2

Additional Tasks

The College approves the assignment of the additional tasks in question to Mr Jerker Asplund, European Delegated Prosecutor, pursuant to Articles 2 and 3(2) of the College Decision 013/2021.

Article 3

Entry into force

This decision shall enter into force on the date following that of its adoption.
